

Coastal Community Action Program

For Kimberly, the most fulfilling aspect of her work is the opportunity to support the dedicated and empathetic individuals who make CCAP the impactful agency it is today.

After teaching high school English for 30 years, Patty Howard felt called into ministry. She is now Associate Pastor of Gather Church and Associate Director of Gather Community Services. In her five years on staff, the scope of Gather's work has grown from a church with food and clothing banks to include a licensed behavioral health agency, a MAT clinic, a syringe exchange, care coordination, two housing programs, a parent education program, a licensed childcare facility, counseling, and extensive community involvement, seeking to meet the needs of the most vulnerable. She pastors both congregants and staff members and she enjoys building relationships with people and offering hope and support.
